MCCA's scholarship program provides recipients with up to \$30,000 to be used for legal education expenses.

The MCCA Lloyd M. Johnson, Jr. ("LMJ"), Scholarship Program is open to all students who have been accepted into law school to start in the fall of 2011 pursuing a juris doctor (non-LL.M.) degree. Only students enrolled in a full-time, ABA accredited, day program with an anticipated graduation date in Spring 2014 are eligible to apply. The goal of the program is to promote academic excellence and diversity in law schools by awarding newly accepted law students from disadvantaged backgrounds with scholarships to help defray their education expenses.

Scholarship recipients will receive a \$10,000 award for the first year of law school. Recipients may qualify for additional financial support in years two and three.

January 10, 2011: Application process opens. On-line application will go live on the UNCF Web site.

May 31, 2011: On-line application closes at midnight EST on May 31, 2011.

July 15, 2011: Applications screened, and top 40 candidates finalized by MCCA. Non-select letters mailed out to applicants not included in the top 40.

September 2, 2011

On or before this date, MCCA will notify UNCF of all final Scholarship and Fellowship winners. UNCF will notify all students not selected by letter.

Scholarship applicants must meet the following eligibility requirements:

- Be a U.S. citizen (and able to show proof of same, if requested);
- Possess an undergraduate G.P.A. of 3.2 or higher;
- Be a full-time, first-year law student in the fall of 2011 (by showing proof of acceptance into an ABA-accredited U.S. law school on or before the application deadline);
- Demonstrate community service and leadership qualities;
- Have an interest in corporate law, including an interest in working in a corporate law department and/or law firm;
- Demonstrate an interest in diversity;
- Document evidence of financial need; and
- Maintain at least a "B" average throughout law school in order to be eligible to receive funds for the second and third years of legal education (if applicable).



Application Deadline: May 31, 2011
